II. President's Report and Discussion Part I

- State Budget
- Update on Electoral and Legislative Actions—A. Vásquez and L. Elliott-Negri reported that the New Deal for CUNY (ND4C) legislation has been filed and is now in committee, ND4C builds on the history of the PSC fighting for new investment in CUNY. The bill has 17 sponsors in the Senate and 32 in the Assembly.

Part II

• Safe Opening/Reopening Guidelines: The PSC, together with support from our state affiliate NYSUT, successfully pressed the governor to include professional staff on the list for vaccines. Some professional staff will be working on campus as of March 17. Chapter Chairs and H&S, together with the PSC principal officers and staff, have been working on the guidelines that the union needs for a safe and healthy return to in-person work. The union has demanded that the University negotiate with PSC on the return to a safe workplace.

• Bargaining Issues

Bowen reported on pressure to restore the 2 percent raise that was effective on November 15, 2020; on equity raises; on implementation of Paid Family Leave (PFL). The effective date for PFL is March 8 for senior colleges and April 11 for community colleges. PFL can be used with Paid Parental Leave and includes all PSC-represented employees. The deduction is capped and gives employees 12 weeks to care for family members in day-long or week-long periods. The benefit is up to 67% of your salary, capped at an annual maximum.

- Report on EC Actions on Proposed Resolutions: The EC voted not to approve two resolutions: "COVID Testing Protocol Campaign," submitted by the Health & Safety Watchdogs (HSW) and "No New Cold War with China!" submitted by the International Committee (IC).
- Report on Negotiations with NYC on Medicare: Bowen reported briefly on negotiations of the municipal unions with the City on a move to Medicare Advantage.

• Stop TIAA Corporate Investment in Land-Grabs MOTION: "THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the PSC, on behalf of its membership, call on TIAA and its corporate subsidiaries to halt investments in land and agribusiness, divest itself of any land already acquired; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the PSC call on TIAA, while still invested in land to be transparent and inform investors of the names of funds that contain grabbed land and the amount invested, so that members can choose funds that satisfy their ethical requirements; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the PSC educate its members on these issues of TIAA agricultural land grabs; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the PSC urge NYSUT and AFT affiliates with higher education members to support the cessation of TIAA in investing in agricultural land and agribusiness" (Motion: Executive Council) **APPROVED.**

• Time-Sensitive Resolution: In Support of the Bessemer, Alabama Organizing of Amazon
