# I. Approvals

# II. President's Report and Discussion – S. London for B. Bowen

- PSC is involved in a range of activities in coalitions for working people and for more funding for public services—May Day March, CUNY at the Council, renewal of Occupy movement, activity among students; our union hall is being used by a number of groups—a good resource
- 2. Pathways: Resistance continues to build; UFS is initiating next steps on curricular matters; PSC in supportive role. London reported on the union's plans for continuing work to defend academic quality and faculty governance, as threatened by Pathways.
- Adjunct Health Insurance: Both PSC and CUNY are working to maximize available funding and to resolve the issue as quickly as possible. It is challenging to adapt current eligibility and benefits to existing public plans, so the plan will look somewhat different.
- 4. City Budget/Funding for CUNY: PSC continues to press the City Council to enhance significantly Mayor's proposed funding; the message was delivered by PSC lobbyists and students at CUNY at the Council event May 2<sup>nd</sup>. Delegates reviewed the union brochure "Invest in Opportunity," which was well received by City Council and is available on PSC website.
- Jocelyn Wills, Delegate, BC, reported on student action May 2<sup>nd</sup> at Brooklyn College to protest increased securitization and spying on students. Motion for PSC to support a silent vigil at Brooklyn College on May 16<sup>th</sup> at 12:30 was approved unanimously. (Motion: J. Wills; second: S. Leberstein)

Resolved PSC condemns the use of violence and arrests by CUNY security to break up a peaceful student protest; and further

Resolved PSC demands that charges be dropped against the arrested students; and further

Resolved PSC calls for an independent investigation of the incident by an outside party, neutrally agreed to by the PSC and BC management; and further Resolved PSC supports the May 16<sup>th</sup> Silent Vigil at Brooklyn College.

  - Elections Committee Report: Election results were certified on May 8<sup>th</sup>; terms of office will begin May 21<sup>st</sup>. 4,101 ballots were received (28% of those sent out).

  - Deirdre Brill was appointed PSC's new Organizing Director
  - Delegates were asked for support for former Lehman College Chapter Chair
     Helene Silverman, who suffered from a major fire in her apartment. \$600 was raised.

  - AFT Resolutions—resolution on community colleges is still being worked on by an EC Committee that includes CC Officers and the drafter of the original resolution.
- V. Old Business—No action could be taken because a quorum was no longer present.
  - A. Resolution to Condemn Martelly's Armed Raid on a Haitian University Campus will be sent to the EC
  - B. Proposed Procedures for EC and DA Resolutions
    The Chair explained that this resolution is proposed by the EC to clarify the reciprocal responsibilities of the DA, the EC and the Principal Officers. The Chair proposed that delegates discuss it even though a vote could not be taken, and a delegate recommended that it be placed higher on the next DA agenda.
