I. Approvals

A. Agenda

Motion to accept the agenda was approved. (Motion: A. Pearlman; second: A. Sherman)

B. Minutes

II. President's Report and Discussion – B. Bowen

- Adjunct Health Insurance PSC reached agreement with CUNY on a proposal that must now
 be reviewed by the appropriate public sector body. The Welfare Fund Trustees voted to
 extend coverage through October under the Welfare Fund while the agreement undergoes
 final review. President Bowen commends Marcia Newfield for her role on the front line in
 this effort. If we do succeed, it is a moral and political victory for all of us.
- Collective Bargaining The situation has not changed dramatically. CUNY has not made an
 economic offer, and the economic proposals being approved by the State all contain
 concessions. UUP is still in bargaining. New York City has made similar concessionary offers
 to certain municipal unions. The bargaining team is constantly assessing whether and when
 it is strategic to ask for an economic offer.
- Pathways QCC has been on the frontline of resistance to the reduction of classroom hours from four to three for composition courses. Vice President of Community Colleges Anne Friedman convened a meeting just before this one for representatives from community college English departments to discuss the issue. Pres. Bowen makes a commitment to bring all English department faculty together for a meeting. QCC Chapter Chair Judy Barbanel expressed gratitude on behalf of the English Department for their support. The chapter had an emergency meeting this week with Barbara Bowen, Mike Fabricant and Anne Friedman, passed a resolution calling for a moratorium on the implementation of Pathways.

Motion to condemn the reprisals against faculty at QCC for their votes on Pathways and to support the right to vote in an atmosphere of intimidation, with final wording to be determined by the EC, was approved unanimously. (Motion: A. Pearlman; second: S. London)

Motion authorizing the EC to draft a resolution calling for no further action on Pathways until the atmosphere of intimidation has been withdrawn was approved unanimously.

A. Treasurer's Report – M. Fabricant

Monthly Financial Reports – June and July
 Summary of the Financial Report for June 2012

Income: \$1,236,000 Expenses: \$1,018,000 Surplus: \$218,000

Year-to-date (10 months)

Income: \$13,392,000 Expenses: \$13,271,000 Surplus: \$121,000

A deficit of \$574,000 was budgeted for ten months. The financial statement, however, reflects an actual ten-month surplus of \$121,000 when year-to-date expenditures are compared with year-to-date income. Over ten months, we spent \$733,000 less than budgeted and received \$40,000 less income than anticipated. This resulted in a favorable bottom line of \$693,000.

Summary of the Financial Report for July 2012

Income: \$1,338,000 Expenses: \$1,045,000 Surplus: \$293,000

Year-to-date (11 months)

Income: \$14,731,000 Expenses: \$14,317,000 Surplus: \$414,000

A deficit of \$634,000 was budgeted for eleven months. The financial statement, however, reflects an actual eleven-month surplus of \$414,000 when year-to-date expenditures are compared with year-to-date income. Over eleven months, we spent \$1,090,000 less than budgeted and received \$42,000 less income than anticipated. This resulted in a favorable bottom line of \$1,048,000.

Motion to accept the Treasurer's report was approved.

Proposed PSC Annual Budget for 2012-2013

Treasurer Fabricant presented the proposed PSC budget for 2012-13 for delegates' review. The vote on approval will be conducted at the next meeting. M. Fabricant will be here at 5:00pm next month, before the DA, for an open session on the proposed budget. All delegates are welcome. Treasurer Fabricant outlined for delegates the major differences between this year's budget and last year's, including an increased allocation for mobilization and outreach—the CUNY Budget Campaign and the Contract Campaign. We spent much less than anticipated on these lines last year. He also highlighted the costs of litigation on Pathways. On the income side, he projects a 2% increase, due to faculty hiring. The increase in Research Foundation dues is a result of the collection of dues from the field units for the first time.

PSC Mobilization for November Elections – S. London

S. London reported that PSC must redouble our efforts to reelect Obama as well as elect members of Congress who support our agenda. He asked delegates to commit to participate in at least one phone bank. We have endorsed Grace Ming, Tim Bishop, and John Patrick Maloney for Congress. PSC also endorsed NYS Senate candidates Joseph Addabbo in Queens, Andrew Gounardes in Brooklyn, and George Lattimer in Westchester. PSC will do labor walks for these local candidates. Finally, members have the opportunity to go to battleground states for twelve-day stints with the AFT.

PSC is engaged in a 2013 coalition strategy to elect a cohort of progressive City Council members.
